C-1. Matters not appearing on the agenda:

Imperial Resident Charlene Valle, requested to speak. She was accompanied by other members of the community. The issue of concern is with ordinance warnings for violations issued at the Victoria Terrazas Community to all residents living on Saddleback and Meadowbrook Drive. The warning violations were for 13-8.1 obstructing the city right of way. Charlene stated that all of the residents' drive ways are not long enough for the vehicles to fit without obstructing the drive way, and the community streets do not allow parking. This is leaving residents to be fined daily or to park more than two blocks away from their homes.

Ester Frias, requested to speak. She was from the Victoria Terrazas Community. Ester, stated that the drive ways are to be 20 feet long, but her contract states that the driveway is 15 feet long, and some residents' contracts include measurements, while others do not. Ester, stated that she spoke with the code enforcer and asked if the code only applied to a normal driveway, to which he replied that it did. Ester, asked him if a 15-foot drive was not a normal driveway, why would she be cited? She stated she was told that it was not the code enforcer's concerns and that he was to enforce the law. Mayor Dale, advised all residents of Victoria Terrazas that the city is going to work out an action plan and no one will be issued fines for violations while their concerns are being addressed.
