#### BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:

On June 29, 2022, the Imperial City Council adopted Resolutions 2022-38, 2022-39, and 2022-40 calling for a General Election to be consolidated with the Statewide General Election to be held on November 8, 2022. The election was called for the purposes of electing certain officers and for submitting a ballot measure regarding the City's Transient Occupancy Tax. On Tuesday, December 6, 2022 the County of Board of Supervisors certified the results of the November 8<sup>th</sup> Election. Resolution 2022-80 is put before the City Council to accept the results of the General Election as certified by the Registrar of Voters. A summary of the results are as follows:

#### **RESOLUTION 2022-80**

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IMPERIAL, CALIFORNIA, RECITING THE FACTS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2022, DECLARING THE RESULTS AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Imperial, California, on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established, that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for holding of elections in general law cities; and

WHEREAS, the County of Imperial Registrar of Voters, canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to the City Council, the results are received, attached and made a part hereof as "Exhibit A".

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the City Council of the City of Imperial Declares and Determines as follows:

Section 1. That the whole number of votes cast by mail and in-person ballots in the City of Imperial is 4,030.

- Section 6. The City Council of the City of Imperial does declare and determine that Kristina Shields was elected to the Office of the City Clerk for the term of four (4) years.
- Section 7. The City Council of the City of Imperial does declare and determine that as a result of the election to majority of voters voting on "Measure G" amending Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) in the City from eight (8) percent (%) to twelve (12) percent (%) shall be deemed adopted and ratified.
- Section 8. The City Clerk shall enter in the records of the City Council of the City, a statement of the result of the election, annexed hereto as Exhibit A showing:
  - 1. The whole number of votes (ballots) cast in the City of Imperial;
  - 2. The names of the persons voted for; and
  - 3. For what office(s) each person was voted for; and
  - 4. The number of votes given at each precinct to each person; and
  - 5. The total number of votes given to each person; and
  - 6. The total number of votes given to each person, and for and against the measure.
- Section 9. That the City Clerk shall immediately make and deliver to each of the persons so elected a Certificate of Election signed by the Registrar of Voters and authenticated; that the City Clerk shall also administer to each person the Oath of Office prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California and shall have them subscribed to it and file it in the Office of the City Clerk. Each and all of the persons

elected shall then be inducted into the respective office to which they have been elected.

Section 10. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 824**

# ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF IMPERIAL, CALIFORNIA AMENDING CHAPTER 21, ARTICLE IV, SECTION 21-19 OF THE IMPERIAL MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF IMPERIAL DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. SECTION 21-19 of the Imperial Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"For the privilege of occupancy in any Hotel, each transient is subject to and shall pay a tax in the sum of twelve (12) percent (%) on the rent charged by the operator. Such tax constitutes a debt owned by the transient to the City which is extinguished only by payment to the operator or to the city. The transient shall pay tax to the operator of the hotel in the sum of twelve (12) percent (%) at the time the rent is paid. If the rent is paid in installments, a proportionate share of the tax shall be paid with each installment. The unpaid tax shall be due upon the transient's ceasing to occupy space in the hotel. If for any reason the tax due is not paid to the operator of the hotel, the tax administrator may require that such tax shall be paid directly to the tax administrator."

**SECTION 2.** This ordinance shall take effect as provided in Section 9217 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall publish this ordinance according to law.
